Coaching Beyond the Classroom

Students with and without disabilities deserve the same opportunities to make friends, compete in sports and be a meaningful part of their school's culture.

This year, through our Special Olympics **Schools Partnership Program**, we significantly surpassed our goal of expanding our program into new schools, reaching more students than ever before. The program includes the **Unified Champion Schools Program**, which joins students of differing abilities together on the same sports team, as leaders in school and community activities, and as organizers and participants in school-wide activities.

Congratulations to Antelope (Calif.) High School for being named a Nationally-Recognized Banner School! A **Unified Champion School** receiving national banner recognition is one that demonstrates a commitment to inclusion by meeting 10 national standards of excellence.

Elevating Body & Mind

Despite higher health risks, people with intellectual disabilities often face significant challenges in accessing quality health care and obtaining opportunities that promote fitness and wellness.

The Special Olympics Northern California Health & Wellness program aims to help athletes live healthier, longer and more fulfilled lives through Walking Clubs, Family Health Forums, Fitness Seasons, non-invasive health screenings, at-home resources and more. We also worked with community partners such as Stanford University to break down barriers and improve the understanding necessary for healthcare professionals, and students, to treat people with intellectual disabilities.



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85% of healthcare professionals agreed that they would be able to provide better care for people with intellectual disabilities after the Healthy Athletes Clinical Director training.
